Conservation Concern: The Crested Wood-partridge is listed as Near Threatened by the IUCN. This species was upgraded from Least Concern in 2004. The main threat to the Crested Wood-partridge population is loss of habitat and habitat fragmentation across the species broad range.

Habitat conversion to palm oil agriculture has been one of the leading causes of loss of habitat. This species has been observed to return to secondary growth areas,

but the initial augmentation of habitat is still a detriment to the species. Population declines related to habitat loss are compounded by trapping for the captive bird trade.

Species account: The Crested Wood-partridge, AKA roulroul, is the only species in the genus *Rollulus*. This species is very popular with the public and zoo staff alike as they are naturally friendly birds that are striking in appearance and very active.

AZA Role: This small galliformes is a species that, when held in monogamous pairs, does not require a large amount of space. They have a very strong pair bond and are highly interactive with each other on exhibit. Roulrouls are an excellent addition to mixed-species aviaries.

TAG Program Goals: Only a few species of partridge are housed in AZA collections. This species group has been sensitive to the "boom and bust" population trend which makes them susceptible to losing genetic diversity in a brief period. Due to this, the TAG only recommended one Partridge species to allow this SSP to become a larger and more sustainable population. This species is also the rarest of the Partridges represented in AZA. In the future, the relationship with the EAZA population needs to be investigated and determined if an import of unrelated birds is possible.
