Conservation Concern: The Congo Peafowl is listed as vulnerable by the IUCN. Its wild population is estimated at 3,500-15,000. The rarity of sightings of this species and its

elusive nature makes population estimates challenging. Increasing conservation concerns include the bush meat trade and habitat destruction for agriculture and conflict, all of which negatively affects the wild population of this and other species endemic to this region.

Species account: There are three species of Peafowl. The Congo Peafowl is the only species of African peafowl, with the rest ranging into South-east Asia and Indonesia. This unique species was only discovered by naturalists at the start of the 20th century and little is still understood of its natural history. This strikingly colorful bird is excellent for African aviaries as well as standalone exhibits. Birds are typically kept in pairs, but institutions are working to see if housing in same sex groupings in large aviaries is possible.

The original wild caught birds that founded this captive population were acquired by the Antwerp Zoo in 1962. Of the original group, six birds reproduced and are the only founders for this population. Due to the rarity of sightings and the conflict in this region, it is doubtful that new founders will be able to be obtained for this population.

AZA Role: This species is one of a few bird species in AZA that are endemic to the Congo region of Africa. The management goal of this SSP is to provide birds for exhibit and breeding for the regional and international programs. The AZA population has been very active in importing birds to increase the founder representations within the population.

TAG Program Goals: Ownership of all captive Congo Peafowl resides with the Antwerp Zoo. New holders need to be approved by the Antwerp Zoo. If your institution has interest in this species (even if years away), please contact the population manager to start the approval process. More approved holders will facilitate faster placement of birds and their offspring in a timely manner.
