

Audubon Watershed Experience (AWE) program, funded by Chesapeake Bay Trust (CBT)

- Maryland Environmental Literacy graduation requirement
- Partnership between Patterson Park Audubon Center and individual high school science teachers (biology, environmental science)
- Multi-part experience: classroom introduction to the Chesapeake Bay Watershed, field trip to North Point State Park, stewardship project in their school community
- Audubon's goal to reach a diverse audience, connect young people to nature in their community, introduce young people to birding, provide resources for local environmental stewardship

Start "birding" with toilet paper roll binoculars in Kindergarten







Learn to use real binoculars in 2nd grade.

In Winter – create their own class field guide where each student is responsible for researching one bird species common to Patterson Park, practice using binoculars by playing Bird on Your Back game

In Spring – use binoculars outside to conduct a bird survey of Patterson Park, teachers use their data to submit an eBird checklist for the class as part of an extension lesson













Bird Explorers Service Learning

Beginning in the middle grades, City Schools students earn "service learning hours" by engaging in projects and activities that combine meaningful service to the community with curriculum-based learning. In Maryland, every student must participate in 75 hours of service learning in order to graduate from high school.

Service learning is different from working as a volunteer or participating in a community service project: It combines service to the community with academic learning, and shows students how what they're learning in school connects to and is valued in the "real world."
