






"species of most conservation concern from traditional medicinal use in South Africa" (Mander et al. 1997)

The literature reports on low levels of use for traditional cultural reasons, with the birds reported for most traditional medicine markets.

Ngwenya reported that the species was widely found in medicine markets across the province for surveys conducted in 1999-2000.

Mander in 2007 conducted a survey of SGH alongside vulture surveys and found: 1/3 said they sold SGH, but very rarely – with just 1 sold every few years. ¼ for protection from enemies but mostly to prevent thunderstorms.




