



Adding Galliformes to mixed species exhibits

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- There are 25 recommended species in the Galliformes TAG.
 - 9 are Unmanaged Populations
 - 13 are Red Studbooks
 - Only 3 are Yellow SSPs
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- There are many more possible spaces that should be considered for Galliformes.

Wild Turkey

Meleagris gallopavo

- Unmanaged
- AZA population: ~250
- Target population: 165
- Conservation status: Least Concern
- Availability: High
- Work well mixed into N. American deer exhibits (not elk)



Himalayan Monal

Lophophorus impejanus

- Currently Unmanaged
- Species champion: Vacant
- AZA population: 37
- Conservation status: Least Concern
- Availability: Private sector
- Easily mixed with arboreal species
- One exhibit with white storks and Cinereous vultures



Temminck's Tragopan

Tragopan temminckii

- Currently Unmanaged
- Species champion: Vacant
- AZA population: 24
- Conservation status: Least Concern
- Availability: Some availability in AZA and many in the private sector
- Mix very well with pigeons, waterfowl, laughing thrushes, magpies, etc.



Siamese Fireback

Lophura diardi

- Currently Unmanaged
- Species champion: Vacant
- AZA population: 7
- Conservation status: Least Concern
- Availability: Private sector
- Mix well with arboreal species
- Can be aggressive during breeding season



Mountain Peacock-pheasant

Polyplectron inopinatum

- Currently Unmanaged
- Species champion: Vacant
- AZA population: 20
- Conservation status: Vulnerable
- Availability: Low
- Mix very well with almost anything.
- Have had some issues with argus and crested wood partridge.



Lesser Bornean Crested Fireback

Lophura ignita ignita

- Currently Unmanaged
- Species champion: Vacant
- AZA population: 7
- Conservation status: Near Threatened
- Availability: Low
- Mix well with arboreal species



Javan Green Peafowl

Pavo muticus muticus

- Currently Unmanaged
- Species champion: Vacant
- AZA population: 6
- Availability: Moderate
- Conservation status: Endangered
- Successfully mixed with Asian hoofstock at Disney
- Have been mixed with argus, tragopans, waterfowl, and many smaller arboreal species



Horned Guan

Oreophasis derbianus

- Red studbook managed by Juan Cornejo
- AZA population: 58 (3 institutions)
- Target population: 75
- Conservation status: Endangered
- Availability: Moderate (requires monetary commitment to conservation)
- More of a canopy species.
- Mixed with doves, small Passerines and ducks with no problem
- Not recommended with curassows



Northern Helmeted Curassow

Pauxi pauxi

- Red studbook managed by Chris Holmes (Houston)
- AZA population: 35
- Target population: 75
- Conservation status: Endangered
- Availability: Moderate
- Have worked well with toucans/aracaris, macaws, jays, and even agoutis and small primates
- Can be aggressive in walk-through exhibits



Wattled Curassow

Crax globulosa

- Red studbook managed by Charlona Ingram (Houston)
- AZA population: 23
- Target population: 75
- Conservation status: Endangered
- Availability: Low
- Have worked well with toucans/aracaris, macaws, jays, and even agoutis and small primates



Blue-billed Curassow

Crax alberti

- Red studbook managed by Chris Holmes (Houston)
- AZA population: 32
- Target population: 75
- Conservation status: Critically Endangered
- Availability: Moderate
- Have worked well with toucans/aracaris, macaws, and jays



Ocellated Turkey

Meleagris ocellata

- Red Studbook
- Program Leader: Amber Carney
- AZA population: 96
- Target population: 100
- Conservation status: Near Threatened
- Availability: Moderate
- Seems to depend on the individual. Most mix well with arboreal species, but generally don't do well with ground species.



Green Junglefowl

Gallus varius

- Red Studbook (currently vacant)
- AZA population: 11
- Target population: 60
- Conservation status: Least Concern
- Availability: Moderate
- Mix well with Passerines



Brown Eared-pheasant

Crossoptilon mantchuricum

- Red Studbook (currently vacant)
- AZA population: 7
- Target population: 50
- Conservation status: Vulnerable
- Availability: Moderate (private sector)
- Have been mixed with magpies and laughing thrushes



Palawan Peacock-pheasant

Polyplectron emphanum

- Yellow SSP managed by Mollie Coym (Houston)
- AZA population: 52
- Target population: 70
- Conservation status: Vulnerable
- Availability: High
- Mix very well with almost anything.
- Have had some issues with argus and crested wood partridge.



Edwards's Pheasant

Lophura edwardsi

- Red studbook managed by Lindsay Jacks (Maryland Zoo)
- AZA population: 16
- Target population: 60
- Conservation status: Critically Endangered (likely extinct in the wild)
- Availability: Some availability in AZA and many in the private sector
- Mix well with arboreal species



Cabot's Tragopan

Tragopan caboti

- Red studbook managed by Eric Kowalczyk (Seattle)
- AZA population: 24
- Target population: 60
- Conservation status: Vulnerable
- Availability: High availability both in AZA and the private sector
- Mix very well with most
- Can be too aggressive for walk-through exhibits during breeding season



Congo Peafowl

Afropavo congensis

- Red studbook managed by Hannah Bailey (Houston)
- AZA population: 35
- Target population: 70
- Conservation status: Vulnerable
- Availability: Currently males available
- Suggested with turacos, smaller hornbills, starlings, and other arboreal birds



Kenya Crested Guineafowl

Guttera pucherani

- Red studbook managed by Maureen Cleary (Sacramento)
- AZA population: 92
- Target population: 120
- Conservation status: Least Concern
- Availability: Moderate
- Mix well with arboreal species- turacos, starlings, weavers, rollers, small hornbills, etc. Avoid other ground birds, though some success with waterfowl.



Vulturine Guineafowl

Acryllium vulturinum

- Yellow SSP managed by Paige Morabito (Zooamerica)
- AZA population: 48
- Target population: 200
- Conservation status: Least Concern
- Availability: Low (population declining)
- Mix well with arboreal species- turacos, starlings, weavers, rollers, small hornbills, etc. Avoid other ground birds, though some success with waterfowl.



Crested Wood Partridge

Rollulus roulroul

- Yellow SSP managed by Dan Brands (Wildlife Safari)
- AZA population: 280
- Target population: 300
- Conservation status: Near Threatened
- Availability: High
- Successfully mixed with argus, Nicobar & pheasant pigeons, waterfowl, and several passerines
- Have been issues with smaller pheasants and will eat eggs of ground nesters



Malayan Great Argus

Argusianus argus argus

- Yellow SSP currently vacant
- AZA population: 61
- Target population: 80
- Conservation status: Near Threatened
- Availability: High
- Mix very well with most including roulroul, mynahs, Nicobars, magpies and many more
- Avoid mixing with peacock pheasants
- Males can be an issue in walk-through exhibits in breeding season
