Parrot Nest Box Designs and Usage

*This is a collection of information gathered from various institutions in AZA/EAZA. The nest boxes described have worked for breeding parrots at individual zoos. The information provided is a guide to aid in breeding parrots, but is by no means the only way to breed certain species.

Macaws:



Nest box used to breed Hyacinth Macaws

Nest box Dimensions:

36-inches in length 26-inches in width 25-inches in height Entrance to the nest is; 10-inches by 9-inches. Inspection door is; 12-inches by 7-inches.



Nest Box used to breed Red-fronted Macaws

Nest box Dimensions:

27-inches length12-inches height13-inches widthLip in front of box is 5 inches in height, the entrance to the box is 7 inches in height.Inspection door is 13 inches by 6 inches.



Whiskey Barrel used to breed Hyacinth Macaws

The hyacinths prefer and have previously been successful on multiple occasions in a whiskey barrel hung horizontally (attached photo is obviously not installed for nesting). I believe it is a 53 gallon which lists the dimensions as:

Height: 35" - 36" Width: 26" - 28" Weight: 90 - 120 lbs

Hinged inspection door: 17" x 6"

Entrance hole: 8"

¾" Plywood used to build nest box.

Pine Shavings offered as substrate.

*Other dimensions that have been used for breeding macaws:

Pressure treated plywood box lined on the inside with ¼" stainless steel

24" tall x 24" wide x 30" deep

There is a 7" x 7" square opening near the top corner of the box

Some of our nest boxes of this size have a platform just inside the opening that the birds can use like a step down to the bottom of the box and some do not.

These dimensions have been used to breed Red-fronted Macaw, Scarlet Macaws and Blue and Gold Macaws.

*Blue-throated Macaws have been bred in nest boxes with dimensions:

³⁄₄" Plywood box that is 12" x 12" x 36"

Conures:



"L" Box or Boot Box

This box has been used to breed Golden Conure and Blue-headed Pionus.

Nest box Dimensions:

L portion of the box is 24" x 24" Bottom: 24"x 12" Top and two short sides: 12" x 12" Long side: 24" x 12" Inspection door: 12" x 12" Entrance hole: 6"



This nest box was used for breeding Sun Conures.

Nest box Dimensions:

Sides: 17" x 11" Top/Bottom: 11" x 11" Entrance hole: 4" Top is a hinged door used for inspection.

Other dimensions on nest boxes that have worked for breeding Conures:

Golden Conure and Illiger's Macaw 1/4" stainless steel rectangular box 30" tall x 12" wide x 12" deep There is a 4" round hole about 4" from the top of the box Phillip Horvey Sedgwick County Zoo





Thick-billed parrots have also, been bred in natural logs and "L" boxes as well. Since Thick-billed parrots are naturally destructive, reinforced boxes are encouraged, such as using metal to edge the sides or additional wood to reinforce the boxes. Some facilities add pieces of wood to allow the parrots to chew and add additional wood substrate to their nest box.

*Used both single and double chambered boxes elevated 4" off the ground. It seems that the double chambered boxes have helped us to reduce (not eliminate) egg breakage by the males or other intruding kea (other females, juveniles in the flock).



Hole in barrel so when bolt is closed a lock can be inserted so bolt can't be opened







Phillip Horvey Sedgwick County Zoo *This is a chamber nest box. It designed with a burrow type nest in mind. The foundation of the nest box is stacked cinder block. The cinder blocks are stacked sideways three deep on a sheet of plywood.

*The tunnel is a 6" pvc pipe that goes into the cinder block chamber.

Palm Cockatoo

*nest box design is built of ¾" plywood. Hexagonal in shape 39" tall, 19" across with a hinged top having a 9" diameter entrance hole.


The interior is laddered on 3 sides with rungs 5" apart. These boxes have to be replaced fairly regularly due to chewing by birds.

* Other facilities have used an open top hexagonal or square shaped box.



The top is a piece of plywood that swivels to act as inspection hole.
