

Why Do We Care About Karamoja?

- The Karamoja region is the poorest region of Uganda, and is home to rare populations of both ostriches and giraffes
 - 785,000 food insecure people
 - ~ 54 Rothschild's giraffes
 - ?? # of ostriches
- Ostriches and giraffes are the most sought after animals on the black market in this region





Kidepo Valley National Park

- Only park in Karamoja:
 1442 sq km
 462 avian species
 80 mammal species
- Only place in Uganda where ostrich can be found
- Only part of Karamoja that remains uncultivated





Behavioral Evidence of Poaching

 Ostrich retreating immediately as we approached, near the Sudan border
 Poached for meat and feathers



Behavioral Evidence of Poaching

- Giraffe retreating shortly after our vehicle stopped
- Poached for meat and tail hair



Protecting Animals by Helping People

 Uganda Wildlife Education Centre (UWEC) developed a plan for an ostrich farming project in Karamoja:

- Train local people in business practices, nutrition and ostrich husbandry
- Incubate eggs collected from confiscated ostriches now housed at UWEC
- Provide five ostriches per farmer to start, and incentives for growing their flock
- Help to develop a legal market for ostrich products
- Encourage eco-tourism





Protecting Animals by Helping People

No

Problem!

- Improved financial and nutritional status should reduce poaching pressure on both ostriches and giraffes
- All UWEC needed to get started was an incubator...

...Send and ostrich incubator to Uganda....?



Cue the Hurdles...

- SB Zoo focuses on native species conservation, so I was basically on my own
- I knew nothing about incubators
 - They are expensive
 They are HUGE
 & What's a hatcher?!
- And very little about ostriches

 The subspecies conundrum begins...





The Subspecies Question

- S. c. camelus vs S. c. maasiacus
- No one could say definitively which occurred in Karamoja
- Literature showed their ranges meeting near Karamoja
- Photos shared by UWEC were not conclusive
- While on the feed truck at UWEC, Sheri innocently asks:

"Why are these ostriches bald?"





 50 egg Natureform incubator & hatcher now at UWEC in Entebbe, Uganda

Meetings last summer with local leaders and government partners indicate broad support:

- Uganda Wildlife Authority
- Karamojong leaders
- Tourism for Biodiversity
- African Wildlife Foundation





Next Steps: Kidepo Valley NP

- Perform giraffe census & establish ongoing population monitoring, July 2014
- Obtain permits to carry out genetic testing to confirm ostrich subspecies
- Conduct ostrich census during this trip as well? (how the heck would we do this anyway?)







